Harvey Shrednick is currently Partnership Development Coordinator for ASU's Center for Advancing Business Through Information Technology (CABIT), a position he has held since the Research Center's inception in 2002. He also teaches Emerging Technologies in the MBA program at the W.P. Carey School of Business. Harvey has been affiliated with ASU for the past 12 years. He was appointed by the Governor to serve on Arizona's Information Technology Authorization Committee from 1996-2000. Also, Harvey was an Arizona Supreme Court Justice-appointee to the Committee of Public Access to Electronic Court Records from 2001-2002.

As a Research Associate with CABIT, he was a key member of the team that conducted a needs analysis for Maricopa County's Department of Public Health, focusing on processes, organization and technology to combat a potential bio-terrorism attack. To assure effective emergency preparedness and response, significant changes were recommended in the areas of data analysis and connectivity. As a follow-up to the County Public Health effort, Harvey was a Co-Principal Investigator for the Arizona Department of Health Services project involving their newly developed surveillance application system. Major changes were recommended to close the process and systems gaps between the State application and the requirements of Maricopa County, the largest Public Health organization in Arizona. Also, Harvey facilitated the development of the information technology segment of a business plan that will eventually lead to an integrated network for the major Community Health Centers of Arizona. He was charged by the Community Health Center's steering committee to recommend the technology infrastructure, processes and organization required to network the 85 individual sites across the state.

Harvey has been a team member of the Arizona Health Privacy project undertaken by a multi-disciplinary group representing Academia, the State Technology Agency and a private law firm. He has provided leadership in facilitating the activities of the Variations Working Group as well as input to the project report submitted to the national consultant.

Prior to joining ASU, Harvey spent 33 years with three Fortune 500 companies, retiring from Corning Incorporated after 10 years as Senior Vice President and Chief Information Officer. He had been the Senior Director of Information Management Systems at Nabisco Brands for the prior 4 years. Previously, he had spent 19 years at the Clairol Division of Bristol-Myers Company in major leadership positions such as Director of Information Services and Director of Warehousing and Distribution. While he was in the private sector, Harvey served as President of the Society for Information Management International, the 2700 member professional association of information technology leaders. He was selected as a finalist for Technology Chief of the Year by Information Week in 1994. Harvey earned his B.S. in Chemical Engineering from the City College of New York and an MBA in Industrial Management from Baruch College.
